## ***Who We Are***

Give to Colombia (G2C) is a U.S.-based non-profit organization that serves as a bridge between international donors and Colombian non-profit organizations. As an intelligence and partnership hub, we support local NGOs by mobilizing resources, talent, and technology to strengthen social initiatives across the country.

## ***Our Mission***

Our mission is to promote social investment by connecting global resources with high-impact social projects that improve the lives of vulnerable communities in Colombia and Latin America.





In Latin America, legacy is deeply connected to community, history, and resilience. Unlike in other regions where philanthropy is often institutional, in Colombia it is frequently personal, discreet, and rooted in local relationships shaped by a long history of inequality.

Like many in the Latin American diaspora, my family and I came to the United States in 2000 after experiencing violence in Colombia. Despite leaving, we remained deeply connected to our country. That connection inspired the creation of **Give To Colombia**—a platform that bridges international donors with high-impact social initiatives that support vulnerable communities across the country.

At Give To Colombia, we work closely with donors, families, and organizations to design philanthropic strategies that reflect their values and address real needs. By identifying trusted local partners, strengthening non-profit capacity, and mobilizing additional resources, **we help turn generosity into sustainable impact.**

Over time, we have also evolved the way we measure success. Beyond tracking funding and beneficiaries, we focus on long-term change and community ownership. One example is a project launched in 2014 that brought water and sanitation to a rural municipality. Ten years later, the entire community is connected to a sustainable water system managed locally.

These stories demonstrate how strategic philanthropy and local leadership can create lasting transformation. For me, this is the true meaning of impact: **building a legacy that strengthens communities and inspires others to give back to Colombia.**

# FISCAL SPONSOR



For over 20 years, Give To Colombia has worked with dedicated fiscal sponsors whose commitment has been essential to our mission. **Their support has enabled us to efficiently channel resources into high-impact projects across Colombia.** Through their partnership, **we have strengthened programs in education, community development, and social inclusion, reaching vulnerable communities with transparency and effectiveness.** **We are deeply grateful for their long-standing trust and commitment to Colombia's development and to creating lasting social impact.**



# TEJEDORES DE SUEÑOS

The “Tejedores de Sueños” project advances economic inclusion for young people with intellectual disabilities in the Urabá region of Colombia. With support from the Tamarin Foundation, Fundación Caricias de Sol strengthened its bakery and pastry production unit, providing 100 hours of technical training, upgrading equipment, including a new industrial oven and creating inclusive employment opportunities.

## *Fundación Caricias de Sol*

The initiative reached **250 direct and indirect beneficiaries**, enabling young participants to develop professional, social, and communication skills while actively contributing to production and sales. The bakery increased its **production capacity and boosted sales by 35%**, demonstrating how inclusive enterprises can generate sustainable livelihoods and empower individuals to play an active role in their communities.





# PROVIDING SOLAR SOLUTIONS FOR SCHOOLS IN LA GUAJIRA

Thanks to a generous donation, **Fundación Pies Descalzos** supported two rural Indigenous schools in Uribia, La Guajira, by **installing solar-powered refrigeration systems to improve food storage and ensure students receive meals in safe and fresh conditions.** The project addressed the lack of reliable electricity in the region by implementing sustainable solar energy solutions adapted to local needs, executed by Soler Solutions.

## *Fundación Pies Descalzos*

**The initiative benefited 744 students** from the Media Luna Jawao and Kasutalain schools. In addition to the installation of the solar refrigeration systems, **330 primary school students received school supply kits**, supporting their educational needs.

By improving access to safe food storage and providing essential learning materials, the project contributed to both the well-being and academic development of children in this underserved region.





# PROVIDING SOLAR SOLUTIONS FOR A SMALL COMMUNITY STORE

A solar energy system and commercial refrigerator were installed in a **Tiendas Solidarias** community store in Youyoupana, improving the storage and conservation of perishable food. **This upgrade has strengthened food access for rural indigenous and farming families, expanded the variety of available products, reduced food waste, and significantly increased the number of beneficiaries** from 12 to 101 families (505 people). **It has also contributed to local economic growth**, with higher sales and improved income for reinvestment in the store's operations.

## *Banco de Alimentos La Guajira*

This initiative was developed in partnership with **Banco de Alimentos de la Diócesis de Riohacha**, an organization committed to addressing food insecurity in La Guajira. **Through Tiendas Solidarias, they support community-led solutions that improve access to nutritious food** in remote areas with limited infrastructure, helping strengthen resilience and food security across vulnerable communities. The installation was made possible thanks to the support and execution of Soler Solutions, who led the technical implementation of the project.







# FEATURED CAMPAIGN

## Otero Liévano



In partnership with **Fundación Otero Liévano**, we hosted a fundraising campaign through our platform to support programs focused on the protection, education, and comprehensive development of girls and adolescents in vulnerable situations in Bogotá.

This initiative reflects what we value most: working together. The foundation brings deep experience and direct impact on the ground, while we support by providing a platform that helps amplify the message and connect more people to the cause.

It has been truly rewarding for us to see this campaign take shape, grow, and gain momentum through this shared effort. There is something special about witnessing collaboration turn into real impact. We are grateful to everyone who has been part of this process.

While we have not yet reached our fundraising goal, we are confident that, through continued effort, commitment, and teamwork, we are close to achieving it and strengthening the reach and continuity of this important work.



# EVENT

## Give To Antioquia



On November 8, 2024, the event **“Connecting with Our Roots”** took place in Miami, bringing together business leaders, philanthropists, and members of the Colombian diaspora to reflect on Colombia’s economic and social challenges and the role that the private sector and the diaspora can play in the country’s development.

The conversation featured **Jorge Mario Velásquez, President of Grupo Argos; Angela Maria Tafur, President of Give To Colombia; and Antonio Bernal, Managing Director at JP Morgan**, who shared insights on opportunities to build a more prosperous future for Colombia.

During the event, **María Bibiana Botero, President of Proantioquia**, presented the **Give to Antioquia initiative**, highlighting how collaboration between organizations and Colombians living abroad can mobilize resources and generate meaningful impact in the region. **The campaign reached 100% of its fundraising goal on the day of its launch, demonstrating the power of collective action** and shared commitment to regional development through the ERA Project. This initiative has supported 726 rural schools across 27 municipalities in Antioquia, expanding educational opportunities for thousands of students.



At the 2024 Latin American Tax and Transactional Conference, our Chairman and Co-founder, Angela Maria Tafur, received the **Baker McKenzie Latin American Pioneer Award**.

When asked what inspired her to start **Give To Colombia**, Angela shared a deeply meaningful answer: her inspiration came from the values she learned at home – **the importance of giving back and treating everyone with compassion and respect**.

Her words reminded us that education and vocational training are not only paths to personal success, but also powerful tools to uplift communities and create real opportunities for those who may not always have the privilege of choice.
